### REDCLIFFE GP SUPER CLINIC

---

#### BACKGROUND:

4. The Australian Government committed a total of \$5 million (GST exclusive) for the establishment of the Redcliffe GP Super Clinic during the 2007 election. The proposal presented by the Foundation was for a \$15 million facility with the shortfall in funding to be met by the Foundation. A funding agreement was executed with the Foundation on 27 January 2009.

6. A further \$5 million was committed to the Redcliffe GP Super Clinic through the GP Super Clinics Program during the 2010 election. A Variation to the original funding agreement was executed on 9 March 2011 bringing the total commitment to the Redcliffe GP Super Clinic up to \$10 million.

#### RELEVANCE TO ELECTION COMMITMENTS/GOVERNMENT POLICY/COAG REFORM AGENDA:

7. The Redcliffe GP Super Clinic was both a 2007 and 2010 election commitment. In the 2010-11 Budget the Government announced an investment of \$355.2 million to improve the quality and accessibility of primary health care services. This funding builds on the \$280.2 million for the initial 36 GP Super Clinics to boost the capacity of primary health care services.
